International Sino-Japanese Conference in Hong Kong. August 10 to 12, 1990, the Chinese University of Hong Kong played host to an immense "International Conference on Sino-Japanese Relations in the Last Century" 近百年中日關係國際研討会 the Hong Kong Society of Asia and Pacific 21 Ltd., the Chiang Chingkuo International Academic Exchange Foundation; the New Asia Cultural Foundation Ltd., and the United World Securities (HK) Ltd., the conference was largely organized jointly by the Chinese University of Hong Kong and Southern Illinois University, Carbondale, Illinois. Indeed, much of the work fell to Tam Yue-him 譚汝謙 and Wu Tien-wei 呉 天威 of these two institutions, respectively. Ninety-five individuals attended from Hong Kong, Taiwan, the People's Republic, Japan, the United States, Canada, Germany, Singapore, and Macao. Chinese and English were listed as the conference's two languages, but 55 of the 64 papers were delivered in Chinese, one or two of them first in Japanese with a Chinese summary. There were, as always, introductory and closing speeches as well as plans for subsequent, similar gatherings.

On the whole, there were many excellent papers presented. Although a great deal of the conference tended to focus on Japanese military aggression on the mainland from the 1890s through the end of WWII--there were three entire panels of twelve papers dedicated to Japanese war crimes--the overall tone remained scholarly. Not all of the paper-givers were able to attend, but all 64 papers were made available. A synopsis of the program (which differed only slightly from the actual paper presentations and discussants) follows. Incongruence in the romanization of the names of the panelists reflects Cantonese pronunciation and disparate preferences between Taiwan and the P.R.C.

Conference on US and Japanese Views on China in the Wake of the Tian'anmen Massacre. A one-day conference was held on November 10, 1990 at the Graduate School of International Relations and Pacific Studies, University of California, San Diego, on the theme of "Comparative Japanese and American Views on the Future of China." Professor Chalmers Johnson of the IR/PS was the principal organizer.
